Learning Should Be Fun!

Exercises focused on pronunciation are usually not popular, learners are bored, and teachers struggle to attract them. In the course we will show that this may not be the case at all! We'll look at how to incorporate pronunciation practice into each lesson. We will learn to prepare fun games that allow students to practice typical phenomena of correct pronunciation (pronunciation warm-ups, games in space and in groups, rhythm training, intonation with chants, fun rhyming, etc.) .

We will tackle the issue of using phonetic transcription and how to introduce it to children in a way that is adequate to their abilities (you will be surprised how easy it may be!).

In the course you will find **a number of practical ideas** that you can immediately try with learners. You will learn to prepare games and worksheets according to their needs.
